About United Way *Summer Champs*

United Way *Summer Champs* is a collaborative effort between United Way of Greater Portland and the Libra Foundation. United Way *Summer Champs* provides camp scholarships to 4th, 5th and 6th grade students in the Portland Public Schools to attend up to three Maine camps of their choice. United Way *Summer Champs* offers fun, friendships and adventure for children while enhancing self esteem.

Note: There has been a funding change. Students who are currently in the 4th, 5th or 6th grades Portland Public Schools for the 2009-2010 academic year are eligible for \$500. Any camp costs above and beyond this amount are the responsibility of the parents.

How to Enroll in United Way *Summer Champs*

1. Select the camp that you and your child feel best meets your child's interests and needs. Please remember that United Way does not own, operate, manage, certify, endorse, license, evaluate, monitor or select the camp that you and your child choose for them to attend. It is your responsibility to select and apply to the camp that is most appropriate for your child.

2. You can get your United Way *Summer Champs* Application from your school principal. Fill out the United Way *Summer Champs* Application Form #1 and have the principal sign it. The school will return the form to United Way *Summer Champs*.

After Application Form #1 is processed by United Way *Summer Champs*, you will receive an acceptance letter with a *Summer Champs* ID# and Camp Selection Form #2.

3. Once you receive your United Way *Summer Champs* acceptance letter with the *Summer Champs* ID# and the Camp Selection Form #2, contact your selected camp(s) directly to provide them with your child's *Summer Champs* ID# and register them at the selected camps. You must then let *Summer Champs* know where you registered by filling out Camp Selection Form #2. This important information makes payments possible to the camps you have selected. No child will be able to attend camp if their Camp Selection Form #2 is not received by *Summer Champs*.

The deadline for the Application Form #1 is April 16, 2010.

The deadline for the Camp Selection Form #2 is May 14, 2010.



Selecting a Camp for Your Child

Finding a camp that is a good fit for your child's needs and interests is very important. It is also important to assure that your child will be in a safe and healthy environment that enhances personal development. Some information can be gleaned from camp websites, but it is also important to speak with the director or key staff members in person or by phone if you have questions.

Summer Champs' Definition of Camp

For purposes of United Way *Summer Champs*, administered by United Way of Greater Portland, "camp" means a combination of program and facilities established for the primary purpose of providing organized social, recreational, physical and educational experiences and activities for children that is operated and used for three or more consecutive days during the months of summer when school is not in session. "Camp" includes day, residential and trip camps. Private tutoring, private lessons, educational tutoring programs, summer leagues and private clubs are not considered camps and are not reimbursable by United Way *Summer Champs*.

Basic Camp Requirements

United Way asks all camps to certify that they meet the basic requirements for camps, **but does not endorse or evaluate camps or monitor their compliance with these basic requirements.**

To participate in United Way *Summer Champs*, all camps must have:

- qualified instructors - minimum of CPR/first aid training
- an established site
- adequate and appropriate insurance coverage
- safe vehicles
- a clear description of the activities offered, including hours and days
- fee statement

Questions Parents Should Ask Any Camp (Day, Residential or Trip)

Camp Background

- What is the camp's philosophy? How long has the camp been operating?
- Who are the directors? What is their background? How long have they been with the camp?
- Do you feel comfortable with the directors or staff you meet?
- Is the camp licensed by the State of Maine? *Note: Not all camps must be licensed. All residential camps and many wilderness camps must be licensed. State Division of Health Inspections, licensing of youth camps can be contacted at 207-287-1978.*
- What are the tuition, extra fees and refund policies?

Staffing

- What is the hiring process of counselors and other staff?
- Does the camp interview the staff, check references and conduct background checks? *A camp that screens applicants and does background checks is more likely to eliminate unsafe counselors.*
- Does the camp use volunteers? If so, are they also screened as above?
- What is the camper/staff ratio? State of Maine camper/staff minimum ratio guidelines:

Ages Served	Counselors	Campers
6 years old and under	1	5
7 - 8 years old	1	6
9 - 14 years old	1	8

- What is the age range of the staff and the average age?
- How many staff were retained from the prior year? Anything over 50% is excellent. If less than 30%, ask why.
- What kind of training does staff receive?
- Are the staff appropriately certified? Lifeguards must be certified and of adequate number; someone on site should be CPR certified.

Health & Safety

- Does the camp have liability insurance? If not, why? All camps should carry a liability policy appropriate to the scope of their activities. If this is very important to you as a parent, you may ask for policy limits or a copy of the policy.
- What is the emergency medical plan? In cases of families with limited English speaking skills, how will camps and families communicate about their campers, especially in emergencies?
- What procedures are in place to help ensure a camper's safety with other children and staff at the camp? (For example, what is the supervision policy for children while they are changing their clothes?)
- What security measures are in place for the physical camp and facilities? What measures are in place during special activities (especially high-risk activities) and when transporting children by vehicle and on field trips?
- If vehicles are used for transportation, ask if the camp follows manufacturer's guidelines for number of passengers per vehicle. Will every child have a seat (and seat belt, if provided)?
- If your child has special needs, religious restrictions, food allergies, chronic illness, disability - ask if and how the camp can accommodate them.

Program

- How structured is the program?
- What activities are required? Are there alternatives offered?
- Ask yourself - Will your child enjoy greater freedom of choice or feel happier with a more structured time table?
- How competitive are the activities? How does the camp assure no child is being left out? How do they deal with bullies or taunting?
- How does the camp handle children who are missing home?
- What do campers do in bad weather?

References

Ask for references - get contact information for other camp families and don't be afraid to call. You will pick up valuable insight.

Residential Camps - Additional Questions

- Check the sleeping arrangements, toilets and shower facilities. Will your child be comfortable with them?
- What kind of food is served and who prepares it? Are all health codes enforced and have they passed health inspections? Does your child have food choices? Are they required to "clean their plate"?
- Is the camp accredited by the American Camp Association (www.acacamps.org) or reviewed by another review body? ACA requires a camp to meet nearly 30 mandatory health and safety standards and demonstrate compliance with 300 others. ACA accreditation is not required but many camps find it desirable. Some camps are reviewed by other national entities such as Boy Scouts and church camp groups. Also, many excellent camps choose not to be accredited. Still, it is a good question to ask.

A Note About Deposits

In some cases, a camp will require a deposit. Some camps have either waived the deposit or they have reduced it for United Way *Summer Champs* participants. Either way, the camp will reimburse your deposit once your child has finished camp and United Way *Summer Champs* has paid the bill. It is the parent's responsibility to follow up with the camp regarding their deposit. If, for some reason, the camp does not reimburse the camper's deposit, please contact Kimberly Curry at 207-874-1000 x 314 at United Way of Greater Portland for assistance.
